



Bus stops around Croxteth Country Park

- Bus stops at Dwerghouse Lane/Oak Lane entrance:**
- 1 route 18A to Croxteth Park, route 62A to North Park, route 121 to Aintree, routes 215/216 to Croxteth Park/Walton
 - 2 route 18A to City Centre, route 62 to Penny Lane, route 121 to Broadway, routes 215/216 to Croxteth Park/Walton
- Bus stops at West Derby Village (Mill Lane/Town Row):**
- 3 route 61 to Aigburth Vale
 - 4 route 61 to Bootle
 - 5 routes 12/13 to City Centre
 - 6 routes 12/13 to Stockbridge Village
- Bus stops at Croxteth Hall Lane/Deysbrook Lane:**

 - 8 routes 12 to Stockbridge Village and 898 to Page Moss

This Guide shows all the routes that serve Croxteth Hall and Country Park. It gives details of how often buses run, and where the bus stops are in relation to the Park and its attractions.

Recommended cycle routes to the Park are also shown. Cycle parking is available next to the Main Hall.

Using public transport, walking or cycling to the park will not only improve your fitness and health but also contribute to reducing congestion and improving Liverpool's environment. The Park provides a wide variety of trails and paths to explore and enjoy the 'countryside in the city'.

Croxteth Local Nature Reserve is situated within Croxteth Country Park and covers over 85 hectares of land extremely important to the wildlife of Liverpool. It is made up of extensive areas of woodland, grassland meadow, agricultural land, ponds, reedbed and hedgerows. The reserve is alive with wildlife all year round.

Access has been improved recently under the Liverpool Local Nature Reserve Project to encourage people to enjoy the value of the range of habitats and experiences present within the nature reserve. New signs and paths have been installed, and woodland and grassland enhancement schemes have been carried out to improve the condition and value of the wider areas of the Park.



Liverpool City Council, along with the Lancashire Wildlife Trust, the Mersey Forest, BTCV and the Friends of Croxteth Hall and Country Park have joined together to resource a wide range of projects aimed at getting people out and about within the reserve. The Lancashire Wildlife Trust runs volunteer days for people interested in actively improving the conservation value within the Local Nature Reserve.
